

1 alcohol pursuant to the special dispenser permit.

2 (a) Persons desiring to consume beer shall be required to wear a
3 wristband that restricts consumption to a maximum of three (3) twelve (12)
4 ounce beers during the course of a professional baseball game.

5 (i) The wristband shall be nontransferable and shall be
6 issued to verify age and to indicate the number of alcoholic beverages
7 purchased.

8 (ii) The purchase of alcoholic beverages shall be limited to
9 one (1) purchase per person at one (1) time.

10 (iii) Twelve (12) ounce beverage containers shall be used for
11 beer.

12 (iv) Alcoholic beverage containers shall be distinguishable
13 from nonalcoholic beverage containers.

14 (b) The sale of beer shall terminate at the end of sixth inning of the
15 professional baseball game.

16 (c) In addition to alcoholic beverages, food and non-alcoholic
17 beverage drinks shall be sold. Water shall be provided at no cost.

18 (d) A manager of the alcohol vendor shall be present at all times in
19 the concession area. A photograph of the manager and his or her name shall be
20 posted at the point of sale of alcoholic beverages. At all times, the manager shall
21 wear a nametag that identifies him or her as the manager.

22 (e) Alcohol servers shall not drink alcohol during baseball games.

23 (f) The vendor shall place signs in the concession area and outside
24 the concession area that indicate the illegality of selling, serving and providing
25 alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.

1 (2) Any professional baseball league games subject to this section, shall not
2 take precedence over the scheduling of local youth baseball leagues using Fort Marcy
3 Ballpark.

4 E. An area of Fort Marcy ballpark, designated as a beer, wine and margarita garden,
5 and permitted in accordance with all city and state requirements, may be used for the sale and
6 consumption of beer and wine during the fiesta council mariachi extravaganza concert, if a valid
7 permit is acquired from the city of Santa Fe. The event sponsor shall comply with the
8 requirements of 23-6.3 SFCC 1987, except that alcohol content may exceed the allowable limit to
9 permit the sale of margaritas. Margaritas must contain no more than one and one-half (1.5)
10 ounces of alcohol per drink, and shall be served in six (6) ounce beverage cups. Any alcoholic
11 beverage served shall not be greater in size or alcohol content than the generally accepted
12 standard drink. Purchases of margaritas are limited to two (2) per person, and shall be regulated
13 by all conditions provided in Section 23-6.3 SFCC 1987. Consumers shall either consume only
14 margaritas, or wine and beer, but shall not consume a combination of margaritas and wine or
15 beer. Alcohol providers shall follow best practices at all times. This section shall be reviewed by
16 the governing body within one (1) year from the date of adoption.

17 F. An area of the Railyard park, designated as a beer garden and permitted in
18 accordance with all city and state requirements, may be used for the sale and consumption of beer
19 and wine, during the bike and brew festival if a valid permit is acquired from the Santa Fe
20 railyard community corporation. This section shall be reviewed by the governing body within
21 one (1) year from the date of adoption.

22 G. Buildings owned by another party located on land owned by the city.

23 H. On land or buildings owned by the city for which the city has entered into a lease
24 with another party for six (6) months or more except for the Railyard park, Plaza and Alameda (as
25 defined in the Deed of Conservation Easement dated October 1, 2004) where alcohol is

1 prohibited, unless specifically permitted under Subsection 23-6.2 SFCC 1987.

2 I. In or on railroad cars located on railroad tracks except as prohibited by state or
3 federal law.


4 All other applicable approvals required by state or city laws and regulations shall be
5 obtained prior to the sale or consumption of alcoholic beverages on the property described in this
6 subsection 23-6.2.
